HIV EDMONTON WELCOMES SHELLEY WILLIAMS

Shelley has worked in the non-profit world for 30 years. For the last 11 years, she has been the C.E.O. of Bissell Centre, an inner city agency in Edmonton. Prior to Bissell, Shelley was the Executive Director of the YWCA of Edmonton and of Edmonton Women's Shelter-WIN Houses.

Shelley is passionate about her work and is known for her expertise in organizational development, strategic planning, and helping organizations find their way through crisis and periods of transition. She focuses on fostering community collaboration and partnerships among those with whom she works.



In 2003 Shelley was selected for a fellowship with The Muttart Foundation. The completion of the fellowship resulted in the publication of a manual called "Social Enterprise: The 3 P's – Philosophy, Process and Practicalities." The book was designed to provide information to organizations considering the development of social enterprise as a means of furthering the organization's mission.

In 2004 Shelley returned to Bissell Centre from the Fellowship and undertook a major capital campaign called "Building Bissell-More Space for Human Being." Within 4 years the agency built 3 new facilities and completed major renovations at their initial facility while continuing programs and services. Ultimately the campaign successfully brought in over 7.5 million for the capital projects and agency operations.

In 2010, Shelley resigned her position as C.E.O. of Bissell Centre and is continuing her small business established in 1997 – Shelley Williams Consulting. Over the years clients have included: Alberta Museums' Association, HIV Edmonton, Boyle Street Community Service, Connect Society, United Church of Canada – Northwest Conference, and many other organizations across the Alberta province.
